Special Traffic Options Program for Driving While Intoxicated

THIS ISSUE HIGHLIGHTS THE COUNTY 'LOCAL OPTION' PROGRAMS

New York State is recognized nationally as a leader in traffic safety and in particular for continual progress in reducing alcohol-related motor vehicle crashes and fatalities. New York's STOP-DWI program is the Nations' first and, to date, only self-sustaining impaired driving program. Other States have implemented components of self-sufficiency, but none to the degree of New York State.

New York's program empowers counties to coordinate local efforts to reduce alcohol and other drug related traffic crashes. Each County has a STOP-DWI Program that reflects the needs and priorities of its own communities. This "Local Option" allows for specially trained police units dedicated to DWI enforcement; special prosecutors and probation officers to handle the caseload; support rehabilitation services and public information and educational campaigns tailored to the communities within each county.

The Program functions as a financially selfsustaining alcohol and highway safety program. STOP-DWI efforts are funded entirely from fines paid by convicted drunken drivers, no tax dollars are used.
