Description

This course will break down the three phases of a DUI investigation: Vehicle in Motion, Personal Contact, and Pre-Arrest Screening. In each phase, the instructor will break down the nuances of that phase and the subtle things officers should be looking for and could commonly miss when looking at the big picture. In addition to the DUI three-test battery, modified Rhomberg balance and finger-to-nose will be discussed as well as the minuit clues that should be noted. Documentation of these subtle clues in the report will also be discussed.
